Spring Recipes

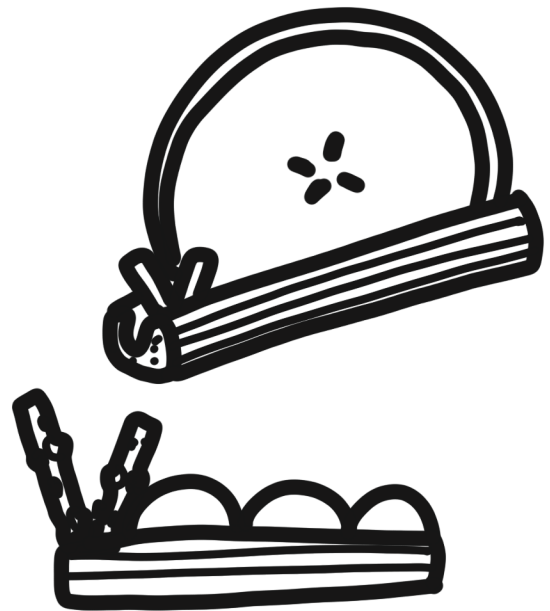


HATCHED CHICK

pineapple slice for the body
sunflower seed for the eyes
carrot for the beak
pretzel stick nest

EDIBLE BUGS

celery stick body
nut/ sun butter/ cream cheese spread
pretzel stick antennae
ideas: grapes cut in half, apple/orange
slices, cherry tomatoes, julienned
carrots, raisins... get creative!



GARDEN IN A CUP

chocolate pudding
crushed graham crackers/Oreos "soil" on top
raisin/m&m "seeds" pushed into "soil"
gummy worm
mint leaves "growing" on top

Bubble ART



dishwashing
soap



bowl with small
amt of water
(1/3-1/2 cup)



food coloring
or liquid
watercolor



straw



thick paper



Step 1: Add a few drops of soap and coloring/paint to the bowl of water



Step 2: Use a straw to blow bubbles in the water mixture. Blow past the height of the edge of the bowl!



Step 3: Remove straw. Lay paper over the bubbles to create a pattern. Use separate bowls if using multiple colors. Adjust the vibrancy by adding more coloring/water.

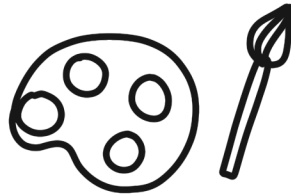


Step 4: Optional: Allow to dry completely then draw a picture or write a note over the bubble background!

Animal PLANTERS



empty, cleaned
plastic containers



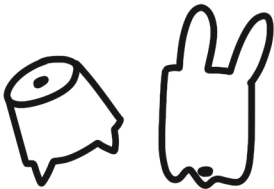
paint &
paintbrush



modge podge
(if placing outside)



scissors



Step 1: Poke a hole at the bottom of your container for draining. Then cut containers with scissors to create ears



Step 2: Coat the outside of your planter with a thin layer of modge podge. Allow to dry



Step 3: Paint the planters the color of your choice. Allow to dry. Then add in faces!



Step 4: Fill with soil, plant a seed, water and wait!

If you don't have seeds at home try planting a bean, a piece of potato that includes an eye, an end of a green onion that includes the root, or a cutting from another plant (with parent permission!)

Egg Carton SHAKERS



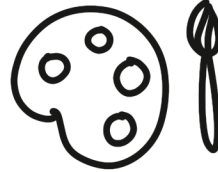
egg carton

rice/beans



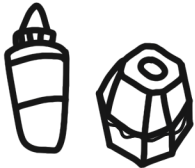
paint &

Step 1: Add a small handful of beans/rice to an egg carton cup.



Step 2: Glue a second cup to the first. Allow to dry.



Step 3: Paint the outside of the cups. Allow to dry.



Step 4: Add a face, and embellish to create animals or whatever you'd like. Be creative!

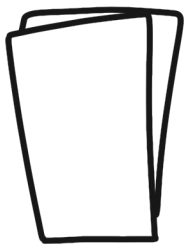


Step 5: Once dry, shake to make some music!



Stained Glass

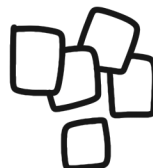
Decor



colored paper



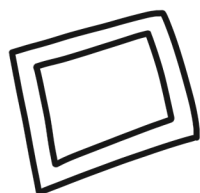
clear contact paper
(clear packing tape works too!)



tissue paper cut into small squares



optional: pressed flowers & leaves



Step 1: Make a "frame" by cutting out the center of a sheet of paper.



Step 2: Cut out various shapes using a different sheet of colored paper.



Step 3: Place a piece of contact paper sticky side up and lay the frame over it.



Step 4: Place cut shapes and optional leaves/petals to create a scene/pattern

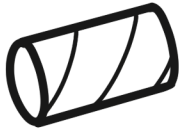


Step 5: Cover empty spaces with tissue paper. Lay a second piece of contact paper over your project sticky side down. Hang on a window and enjoy!

↪ Try different shapes and color schemes! Works without tissue paper too!

DIY Bird Feeder

Easy for the little ones!



empty toilet
paper roll



peanut/sun
butter



birdseed



twine



Step 1: Spread peanut butter on the outside of tp roll

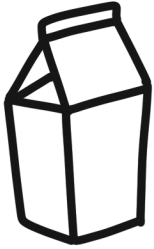


Step 2: Pour birdseed on a plate or sheet pan. Roll tp roll in bird seed



Step 3: Add string then tie to a branch!

DIY Bird Feeder



milk carton



twine



sticks (2)



bird feed



paint



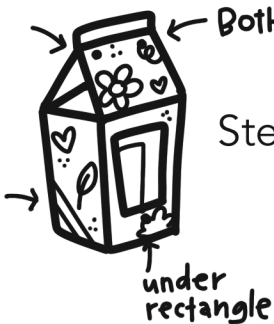
scissors



Step 1: Carefully cut out rectangles on opposite sides of your milk carton



Step 2: Decorate the outside of the carton the way you'd like



Step 3: Punch out holes for string and sticks



Step 4: Add string to hang, sticks for perches, and bird seed. Hang outside. Be patient and wait a few days for birds to discover!
